Species	White mustard
Botanical name	Sinapis alba
Ploidy	2
Seeding rate	25–30 kg/ha as catch crop
Distance between rows	as cereals
Sowing period	from late July to late August
Sowing depth	2–3 cm

Variety description

PIRAT is a very late-flowering white mustard variety and belongs to the non-resistant mustards family. PIRAT is also very stable, making it ideal for strip-till. The low inclination to flower and high mass formation in the early development make PIRAT an absolutely top-class variety in the non-resistant mustard range.

High mass formation in the early development
High stability
Extremely low and late flowering
