#### Variety description

BRIGADIER is a polyploid Barres type. This orange fodder beet variety produces very high yields of up to 1,500 quintals per ha and produces very few shoots. The very smooth, massive beets are easy to lift cleanly either mechanically or by hand. The huge leaf mass remains fresh and healthy until the crop is lifted. BRIGADIER provides very tasty feed which keeps well and has a good dry matter content. The beets can be fed to animals as they are or after cutting.
