Variety description

SABRINA is a new lucerne (alfalfa) variety from Italy. Very high yields and excellent fodder quality are the distinguishing features of this variety. The plants exhibit rapid early development and have good overall competitive ability. ensuring effective weed suppression. SABRINA is well-suited for frequent cutting as it regrows quickly and is highly persistent. Its fine stem and high leaf yield makes it a valuable fodder crop for cattle feed. Loss of crop due to disintegration is also lower during fodder harvesting.
