

Variety description

PAVLA is a high-performing fodder kale variety that is primarily characterised by a low tendency to lodging and attractive yield levels. It grows handsome leaves and can survive many winters in temperate climates.

High-yielding Stable Ample leaves

Usage

Marrow-stem kale, also known as fodder kale, belongs to the brassica group. A biennial, very winter-hardy plant, marrow-stem kale is characterised by its thickened central shoot and is mainly used as a catch crop and fodder plant. With its thickened shoots and thick, fleshy leaves, marrow-stem kale is able to absorb large amounts of nitrogen and preserve it through the winter in a way that prevents leaching.
